

FIRST AID

- Emergency vehicle designated access for entire event is 1st gate in Armagh Crescent with the exception of emergency being within the buildings themselves when emergency vehicles will be directed straight to site.
 - The First Aid area is located in the Lower Function Centre or ask anyone with Volunteer identification.
 - First Aid area is equipped with easy chair, first aid box and number of on duty first aid personnel and numbers/location of local Hospital, Doctors and Chemists.
 - Qualified First Aid personnel who have volunteered their services will operate on a 24/7 roster basis throughout the event. Call club phone on 0431 559 636 current duty person and the number printed in the entrants programs.
 - Duty first aid personnel will have a hand held radio so other on duty attendants can be simultaneously called to assist immediately if necessary.

FIRE

• Emergency vehicle designated access for entire event is 1st gate in Armagh Crescent with the exception of emergency being within the buildings themselves when emergency vehicles will be directed straight to site.

DESIGNATED EMERGENCY MEETING POINTS ARE

on the grassed area between the Oval and Karadoc Avenue beside the double gate entrance or in the park camping area between the BBQ and the rear perimeter fence.

These meeting points are indicated on the map in your entrants program. Please familiarise yourself with these points on arrival.

ALERTING PROCEEDURE

- PA announcements will be made unless the emergency renders this unusable or inaccessible. In the event of this on duty personnel will have specific areas to check, warn/alert and assist evacuation according to emergency type and if it is safe to do so. If asked to move at any stage please obey instructions immediately.
- Entrants are asked if no volunteer personnel are present to advise any emergency immediately to 000 if severe using vehicle access instructions detailed above. Then or if not severe immediately call the club officials on 0431 559 636.
- Copies of event name register will be at both meeting points so people can be accounted for. Please look for the person with the list to have your name checked off and then DO NOT leave that point until advised it is clear for you to do so.

FIRE PROTECTION POINTS

- Fire extinguishers are on the official event vehicle so call duty personnel number
- Additional extinguishers are located by the BBQ in the park area and in the Admin area located in the Lower Function Centre.
- For hose reels etc see map in your program for locations.

MENACE – The Basic Story

HIGHWAY MENACE, reborn 1997 FORD TRANSIT VAN LWB MID ROOF.

The van was bought as a white commercial, for business use- mobile t-shirt sales at car shows. I didn't want to look like all other traders and wanted to fit into the car show scene. My life's motto is "Dare to be different," hence the marbleized paint. The interior was originally fitted out for the business with a grey interior with storage and workspace. I was forced into retirement due to severe illness 6 months after purchase of the vehicle.

I was a vanner in the late 70's and 80's and got the bug back badly. As I'm on a pension finances are quite strained, hence several subtle changes to the interior until the van is as you see it now.

Apart from a custom paint job of House of Kolor marbleized in Kandy apple red and Kandy apple cobalt blue the vans exterior is completed by the addition of twin 3" laker style side pipes (working), under body LED bars & strobes, and rides on Dragway custom billets (16 x 7 front and 16 x 8 rear) fitted with Kumho 857 tyres to comply with legal load ratings. In its life the van has traveled 750,000 km partly as a work vehicle, mostly as a show Van. Traveling any where from South Australia to Queensland.

The interior is not what you would expect to see in a Transit van either. The custom interior features fully pimped out night club theme complete with full audio visual system including 10 screens, 2 dvd players, sub woofers, and effects lighting and a fully usable STRIPPERS POLE.

The van is an everyday driver, we use it for camping, fishing, car runs, car shows, shopping, moving furniture, taking the families large dog for drives. This vehicle has always traveled under its own steam and lives its entire life outdoors and has never been garaged. Unfortunately it has even been side swipped (and been repaired since) & Financially written off once. My motto in life is "Dare to be different." I believe if you don't take it out & use it you might as well lose it.

PS: It's still changing all the time.

6pm doors will open to the stadium. The party begins! BYO alcohol. First course served around 6.30pm. Please wait for instructions. You are in for a night of fun and games! We are looking forward to seeing your 70's outfits and hope you bring lots of energy!!!!

Trophies for costumes and games will be up for grabs as well as the vehicle ones.

Sunday Morning.

Early morning to early afternoon you are welcome to spend some time at our Mildura100 view point. Directions are near the maps. The fastest boats will be first (approx 8am usually) and will return again from about lunch time.


7pm - Charity Auction will commence in the Stadium and will be followed by the awards presentation. Supper will be provided at the end.

FRIDAY WENTWORTH CRUISE DIRECTIONS

- * Exit venue and turn left. Proceed to 16th Street (first major intersection)
- * Turn right and proceed to stop sign at Benetook Avenue.
- * Turn left and proceed to roundabout at 17th Street
- * Turn right and proceed to major intersection at Deakin Avenue. This is the Adelaide Highway.
- * Turn left and proceed out of town, past airport several kilometres (approx 8 k's). Just prior to entering the speed restriction zone of Merbein South turn right into River Avenue
- * Proceed several kilometres to first major intersection and veer left towards Merbein and Wentworth.
- * Follow signs to Wentworth which will lead you straight through Merbein, Several kilometres later you will have to cross the Abbotsford bridge. This is a single lane bridge controlled by traffic lights alternating traffic. Once across this bridge you are now in New South Wales.
- * Proceed into Wentworth and turn right into Adams Street (Broken Hill Road). Turn into the Fishers Carpark immediately on your right and park.
- * The bakery across the road and cafe will be open for food and drink purchases.
 - We will leave from here and proceed to the Old Wentworth Jail as directed. Food is allowed in the Jail but not available there. Some drinks will be on sale there.







SUNDAY MORNING BOAT RACE VIEWING

- * Exit venue and turn right. Proceed through traffic lights to first major intersection (14th Street)
- * Turn right and proceed several kilometres to the intersection of Cureton Avenue.
- * Turn left and not far down turn right into the dirt track leading to the river and Psyche Pumps. There is a sign post on the corner direction to the pumps.
- * When you see the pumps head to the left of them to the oval area. We have permission to place vehicles on the oval itself.
 - The other side of the oval is the river and a prime location to view the Mildura 100 Ski race.

RACE INFO

This is one of Australia's most famous River races!

Boats come from all parts of Australia and often from overseas to participate. It is 100k's long being 50 k's up the river where all the boats stop and wait. When all boats are there they proceed back again for the second 50 km stretch. The view point we have is one of the fastest sections of the race and boats could be travelling at speeds in excess of 100 MILE an hour with two skiers on behind.

SUNDAY AFTERNOON PHOTOSHOOT

Approximately 3pm if all those interested could make their way into Mildura and proceed to the intersection of 7th Street and Madden Avenue.

Once there please turn towards the river and proceed down the road under the rail way bridge. Immediately turn left and proceed along the river front

Keep to the right of the tennis courts and continue along the river side past the lock and up the steep hill where it will come out onto Cureton Avenue.

Turn left here. Proceed slowly looking for the event Marshalls directions. Some will be directed to one of two available car parks to await placement and others will be directed straight into the lawn photo shoot area.

From the car parks; Marshalls will direct you when you are required to

enter the photo shoot area.

Speed limit of 5km per hour applies in the photo shoot area and as it is an extreme privilege to be allowed to access this then we need to be extremely careful of the lawn area. No sharp turns or senseless behaviour will be tolerated. All repair costs will be directed to the offender.


MONDAY MORNING BOAT CRUISE

The boat will depart from the wharf area on the right as you pass under the rail bridge from yesterdays photo shoot directions.

Best access from the venue would be to

- * Exit venue and turn right.
- * Proceed through traffic lights, straight through the intersection at 14th Street and proceed to the next stop sign (11th street)
- * Turn left and follow into town until you come to a major roundabout with a train line through the centre. (Benetook Avenue)
- * Turn right here and follow road around the sweeping bend, through a set of traffic lights and a large roundabout (to the right you will see the bridge to New South Wales as you proceed through this roundabout.
- * Continue over train line and the next right hand turn will be the road to access the river going under the rail bridge.
- * You will see the wharf car park from here and just use any access to the car park and park.

Mum and dad were driving up past the local bmx track when the van suddenly stalled.





Although no one stopped to help, at least the passing traffic were kind enough to slow down and look at us like we each had three heads.


Turns out it was just a wire that shorted out under the dash and filled the cab with smoke. Scared the crap out of the rents but at least the van was okay.....

Vans are a unique vehicle and they usually reflect a persons personality. When all the vans are cruising together there is no better sight.






Street Legal was owned and built by Steve Marsh. He was very particular, as you can


Everybody got on and just walking around at night amongst the many vans & wagons was met with laughter and new friendships that still last today.

I was rather nervous about compiling a program for a National Event, and at times, quite anxious about the whole thing really, but here we are Van Nats 2014.


